

THE RELATIONSHIP AMONG LEGAL SYSTEMS AND THE TACIT CHANGES BROUGHT BY THE ITALIAN CONSTITUTIONAL COURT BOTH TO THE RELEVANT PROVISIONS AND, AT THE SAME TIME, TO THE FRAMEWORK OF ITS COMPETENCES

This contribution gives evidence to the tacit changes constitutional jurisprudence brought to the relationship national legal system entertains with international and EU legal systems, in the light of the relevant constitutional provisions. These changes testify the growing trend towards a rising political "soul" of the constitutional judge. A reflection is therefore carried out on the "dialogue" among Courts as a valuable resource for guaranteeing the "jurisdictional nature" of the constitutional jurisdiction.
